Dear Parents,

Welcome to our Term Three Primary Afternoon Activity Programme. At LICS we regard these as an important part of your child's education and, although not compulsory, please encourage your child to participate in at least one activity during the course of the week.

Afternoon Activities begin on **Monday 26th April**. Please indicate on the attached form your child's preference for each day. **Return this to the school office by Thursday 1st April 2010**. Activity allocation is on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Although we understand about the occasional late pick-up of your child, please be sure that your child is collected promptly after their activity, as persistent late collection could see your child being excluded from activities for the rest of the term.

Our main sports this term are hockey and athletics and if your child has been invited for under 11- under 13 hockey, you may find your child is required to attend matches outside of school on a Tuesday. You will be informed about these events nearer the time.

Once your child has chosen an activity we expect them to attend this for the whole term. We feel it is unfair for the children who were unable to get a place on an activity, if those children that were selected fail to attend. Therefore, if for any reason your child misses an activity please give the teacher concerned a written note explaining the absence.

If an activity has a low number of participants, this activity may be cancelled and your child will be given another option.

If the activity is a sporting one, please ensure your child is correctly dressed in his/her LICS PE kit, including a hat.

If your child attends Kumon on a Monday or Thursday, please ask them to attend their activity first, as late arrival disrupts the group.

We hope that you and your child will be able to select an interesting and enjoyable programme for this term. If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to contact the Vice Principal or the teacher conducting the activity.

The following fees have to be paid for the specific activities:

- 1) Ballet – this activity is run by outside dance teachers – Anja and Paula. Students should come in dance or ballet clothes. **The charge is 120 USD per term, payable to Anja in the first two weeks of the ballet term.** Failure to do so will result in your child not being able to continue.
- 2) Cookery will incur a fee of **100,000 ZMK per term**, payable to the cookery teachers on the first day. This enables them to buy ingredients.
- 3) Monkeynastics is a fun filled activity to improve balance, coordination and self-esteem in young children. **The charge is now 300,000 ZMK per term, payable to the coach.**
- 4) LICS passports activity is based on a Geography programme that begun 15 years ago at an elementary school in Olympia, Washington. Today the programme has over 25,000 participants all over the world. Members will sharpen their world Geography skills and will study a new country-culture, tradition, music, arts, food and dance each week. They will earn passport ‘stamps’, mastery of skills and Geography expertise. **There is a charge of 50,000 ZMK per child per term.**
- 5) Chess is run by Mr Ngulube: **20,000 ZMK per session, payable to the teacher.** All abilities welcome. They will be having friendly matches against other clubs.
- 6) Karate will be taken by an outside coach Patrick and is run by him. If you have any queries contact him on 0977 49 40 63. **The cost of each lesson is 20,000 ZMK, payable to the coach.**
- 7) Cricket Years 1 – 6. This activity is held by an outside coach and is suitable for beginners and intermediate players; it will incur a cost of **120,000 ZMK per term, payable to the coach at the first session. Call Ismail on 0978 612 075**
- 8) Zambian Cultural Club: a charge of **50,000 ZMK per term** should be paid to the teachers for the purchase of materials used during the activity.
- 9) Indoor and outdoor are a fun mix of arts, crafts and games. There is no charge for this activity.



- 10) PELD is an acronym for Primary Evening of Light Drama for Years 3-6. This activity is our Primary School Production for 2009/10 academic year. It is for those students who will be selected at the auditions and is by invitation.
- 11) Jive Salsa will be run by expert dancers who are **charging 200,000 ZMK per term**. They will include other dances including Zambian Kalindula and Congolese Rhumba. The coaches hope to have inter-school dancing competitions.
- 12) Lawn Tennis coaching will be conducted by Alfred Mwamba at **a fee of 200,000 ZMK per term. The coaches will take 16 players per session**. The coach hopes to have inter-school tennis competitions.
- 13) Beginners Guitar will be at the EYD and the lessons are to be given by Ms Holly Hickling at **a fee of 30,000 ZMK. Only 8 players will make up each class**. Children will need to provide their own guitars.
- 14) The Band is for children who can already play an instrument. It is not for beginners.
